Arthur E. Wright School

Although today a glance at the modern buildings of Arthur E. Wright leads one to the conclusion that the district is a fairly new one, this is not so. The history dates from 1884 when the Las Virgenes School District, which encompassed much of the 77.11 square mile area it covers today, was formed. The only school was a one-room affair that is still standing, though abandoned, not far from A.E. Wright School on Las Virgenes Rd. The next development in the history of the district was the formation of the Calabasas School District in 1888. Comprising the eastern end of the L.V. District, this district's school is still in use today as a private school. The Calabasas school was typical of those in the early districts of California: the one room structure held seven grades, one teacher, no principal and no kindergarten. The pupils' outlook on school, life and standards of conduct were doubtless much the same as today. Miss Theresa Thilmony, who taught at the Calabasas School from 1947 - 1950, says that the students were generally well behaved. Mr. Wright, for whom our school is named, says the boys in the Cornell District weren't

always so good. He remembers, with a twinkle in his eye, a time when he had to come to the rescue of a teacher who

The Liberty School District was the next to be formed. Created in 1896, it was taken from portions of the L.V. and Calabasas Districts. The last district to be formed was the Cornell District in 1913. Its territory was taken from the southwestern part of the Liberty District. In 1921 the four districts voted to join the Los Angeles City High School District. This move enabled the schools to provide services for the high school youths in the area. Ten years later, in 1931, the districts were included in the L.A. Junior College District. The districts remained a rural area with a small population.

Then in 1947 came the most important event in the district's history: the four districts-Liberty, Las Virgenes, Calabasas and Cornell-merged to form one new district - the Las Virgenes Union School District. Mr. Wright, a school board member for almost twenty years, was the prime instigator to unionize the district. Forseeing a population explosion in the mountainous district, the school officials started construction on new classrooms immediately. On May 1, 1950, Miss Thilmony moved her students to the new school and she was assigned a first grade in one of the four new rooms built.

Rapid growth followed. During 1950 four rooms were constructed, in 1956 two classrooms, in 1957 four more rooms and in 1958 four more along with the office and cafeteria. During the 1950's the school was twice threatened by fire that blackened the hills within 100 feet of the school.


Then came the 1960's and with them came the water supply that had held back residential development for decades. Houses went by the dozens and by 1966 the population of the area had doubled from that of 1960. . . fortunately, so had the school capacity of the district. During February, 1965, the Round Meadow School was opened for use by K - 6 with Mrs. Marilyn Winters as principal. Agoura High School was occupied in Sept., 1965 with Mr. Al Acton as the principal. The original Las Virgenes School was renamed Arthur E. Wright in honor and respect for the man who so faithfully had served the entire area. Over a dozen new rooms went up - some portable units - and locker rooms and a library were added. The new Las Virgenes District is a far cry from the four teachers and four schools of the 20's and 30's.

When and wherever you read this - 1966, 1970 or year 2000, in the United States, Europe, or even the Moon - you will have one thing in common with over 250 other people. You will have gone to Junior High in the rolling green hills and valleys of the Las Virgenes Unified School District in 1966.
